NOTICE OF OPPORTUNITY FOR PUBLIC COMMENTS AND PUBLIC WORKSHOPS INFORMAL DRAFT NPDES GENERAL PERMIT FOR STORMWATER DISCHARGES FROM SMALL MUNICIPAL SEPARATE STORM SEWER SYSTEMS

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) will accept written comments on the Informal Draft National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) General Permit for Stormwater Discharges from Small Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems (Informal Draft Small Municipal Stormwater Permit). Following the 60-day comment period, the State Water Board will:

- Prepare and make available a high-level response to written comments; and
- Revise the Informal Draft Small Municipal Stormwater Permit as appropriate and release another iteration for public comment at a future date, after which the State Water Board may consider approval.

BACKGROUND

The existing NPDES General Permit for Stormwater Discharges from Small Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems (<u>Order WQ 2013-0001-DWQ</u>) regulates the discharge of stormwater from traditional and non-traditional small municipalities throughout the state. The existing permit was adopted on February 5, 2013, and has been administratively extended since February 5, 2018. Staff is currently in the process of developing the permit reissuance, with the Informal Draft Small Municipal Stormwater Permit as a step in that process.

Traditional small municipalities include cities and counties. Non-traditional municipalities are those entities that have been designated as municipal-like such as prisons, military bases, hospitals, state universities, state parks, community service districts, fairgrounds, ports, water agencies, and transit agencies.

In addition to requiring regulated entities to address six minimum control measures, the Informal Draft Small Municipal Stormwater Permit includes updates, revisions, and implementation requirements such as the following:

- Trash Provisions (new),
- Optional Alternative Compliance for Stormwater Capture (new),
- Revised Pollution Prevention and Good Housekeeping Requirements to include an Asset Management Plan,
- Revised Public Education, Outreach, Involvement, and Participation Program to require pet waste programs,
- Revised Total Maximum Daily Loads,
- Revised Low Impact Development Design Standards,
- Revised Areas of Special Biological Significance implementation requirements,
- Designation of additional non-traditional entities.
